Well done, Krishna



Keeping Safe

In light of current research there is increasing evidence that Covid 19 is spread more easily through particles of air than through contact with surfaces. In line with Department for Education guidance, it is recommended that we continue to ensure rooms in the school are as well ventilated as possible. We have been implementing this by heating the school prior to the arrival of the pupils and staff and then ensuring the windows are open to allow air flow. We are also opening the blinds to assist with ventilation. Due to the need for ventilation in the classrooms, the effectiveness of the heating system throughout the day is not as reduced.

As the weather becomes increasingly colder, we want to ensure that the children are comfortable in school and warm enough. Please could you ensure the children have a jumper and coat in school. On PE days please ensure that your child wears tracksuit bottoms on top of their PE kit. You may also want your child wear a base layer (thermals, vests or an additional t-shirt) . If the temperatures drop further, coats are often bulky for the children to wear so an additional hooded top, fleece or body warmer may be useful to bring to school.
