



## PE and Sports Premium Funding at Kew Woods Primary School

### Academic Year 2019-2020



The government continues to provide additional funding to improve provision of Physical Education (PE) and Sport in primary schools. The provision of this additional ring-fenced funding, specifically to make additional and sustainable improvements to the quality of PE and sport schools offer, demonstrates the importance placed on PE and school sport by Government and this is something Kew Woods Primary School fully supports. Our vision for using the funding is that all of our pupils leaving Kew Woods will be physically literate and with the knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to equip them for a healthy lifestyle and lifelong participation in physical activity and sport. The funding will be used to further develop and add to the PE and sports activities that we already offer and to build capacity and capability within the school to ensure that improvements made now will also benefit pupils joining the school in future years.

***Kew Woods Primary School provisionally planned to use the funding we received this academic year as listed below. Due to Covid 19 and the national lockdown, some activities could not take place. As agreed, the balance unspent has been transferred to the academic year 2020-2021.***
